



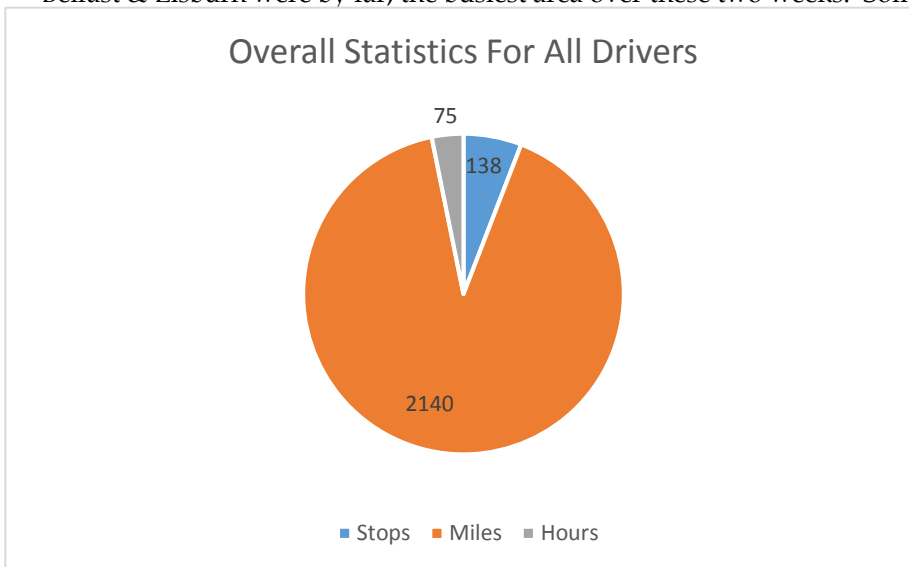
Scouting Ireland and NI Scrubs Initiative

Over the past three weeks different Scouters and SI/SFNI Staff have been working with NI Scrubs to get PPE delivered across the Province. This work sees Scouting Ireland offer their services at the forefront of this battle against Covid-19, ensuring that essential PPE is delivered, as well as delivering the raw materials which go into the making of this PPE.

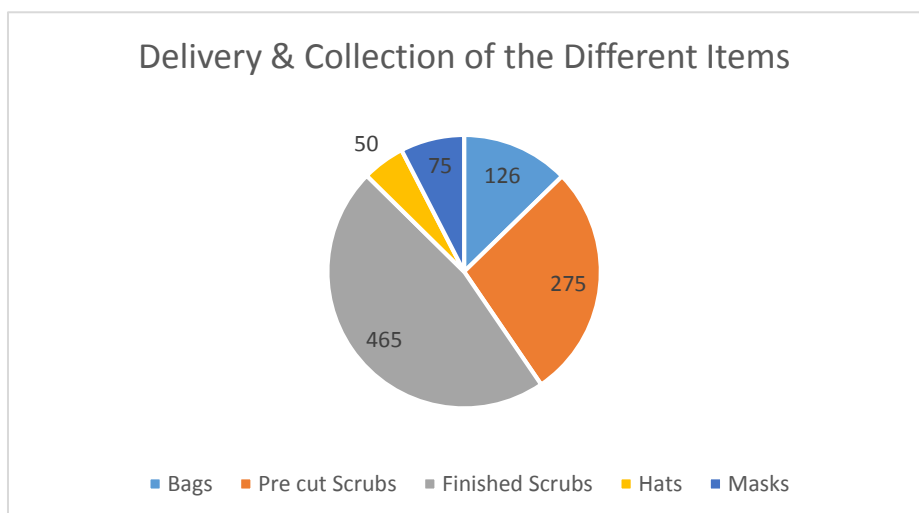
During the last two weeks alone in the Belfast & Lisburn, Derry, Fermanagh & Omagh and Mid Ulster areas we had 14 drivers on the road, covering a total of 2140 miles over 75 hours with a total of 138 collection/delivery stops. Items of PPE being delivered included laundry bags, finished scrubs, masks, and hats as well as pre-cut scrubs and material. Collections and deliveries were made from and to various places throughout Northern Ireland including deliveries to the Musgrave Park Hospital, the Mater Hospital, the South West Acute Hospital, Enniskillen and the Royal Victoria Hospital.

Belfast & Lisburn were by far, the busiest area over these two weeks. Some of the statistics, can be viewed below

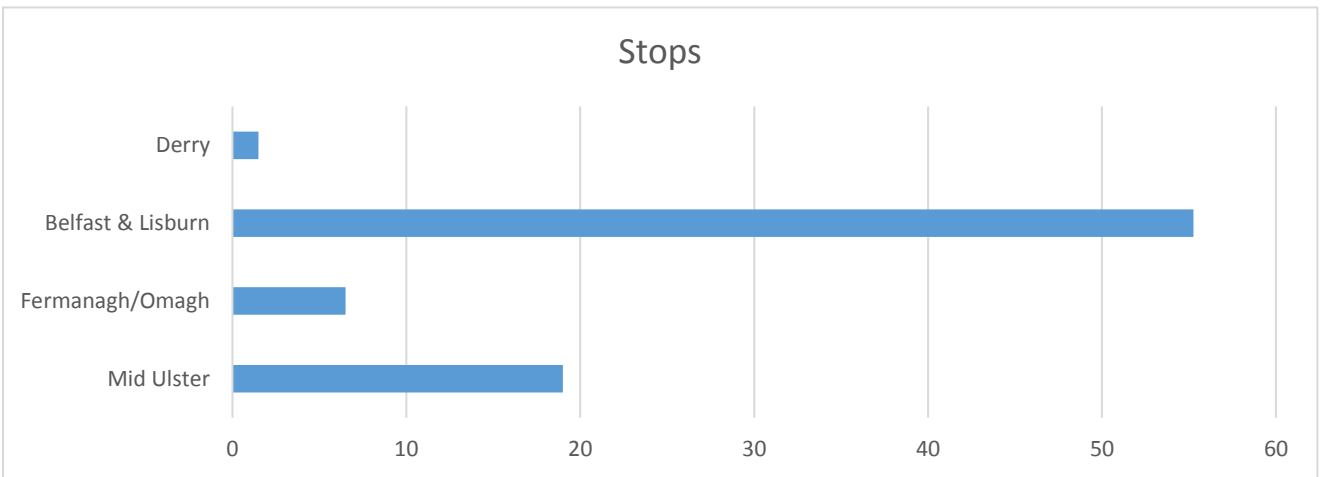
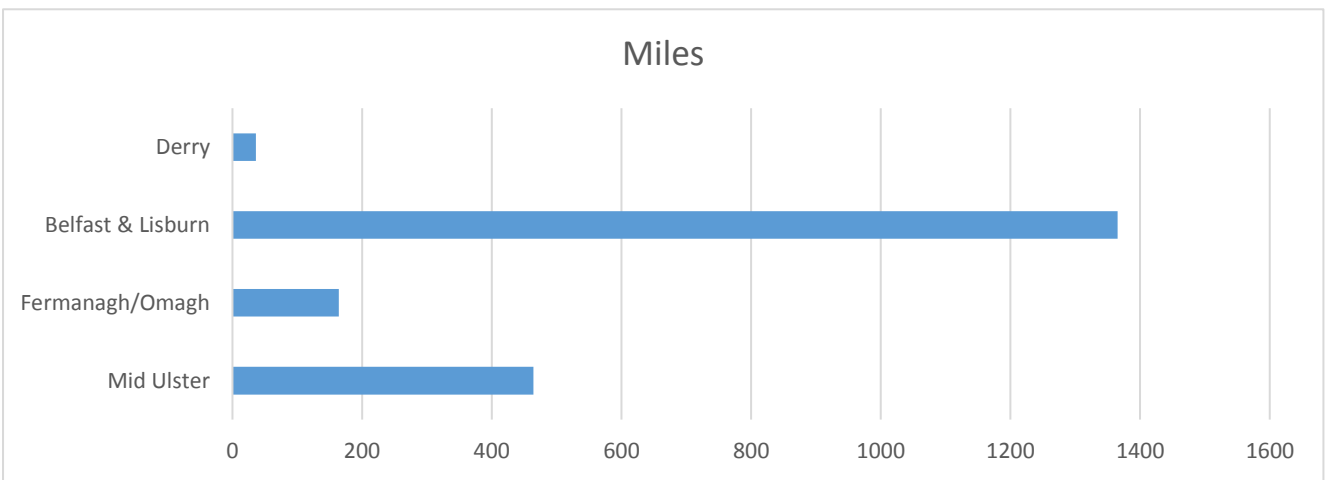
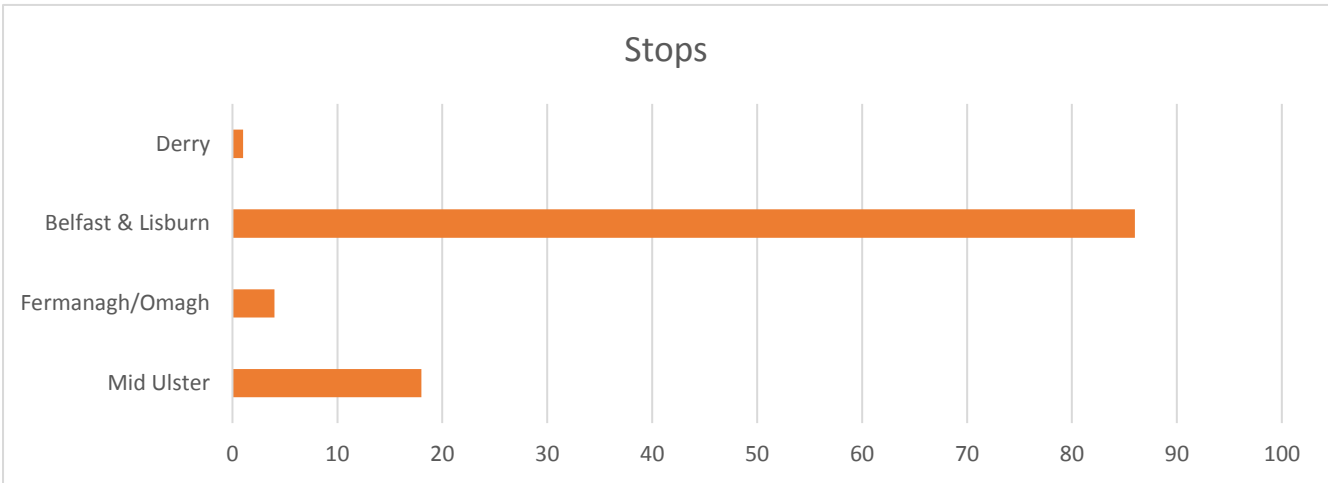


The pie chart shows the overall statistics for all 14 drivers in relation to the total number of miles, the total hours and the total number of stops made.

These statistics show us the different items of PPE which have been collected and delivered by our drivers over the past two weeks. This does not include the collection and delivery of 100s of bags of material which were collected in Scout Dens all around the Province.
