

National Cub Scout Challenge



The National Cub Scout County Challenge will take place in Larch Hill on 17th - 18th June 2017.

Qualifying teams from Scout Counties will compete to win the perpetual trophy.

The Challenge will be a fun and inclusive activity that encourages Sixes to participate, with or without Scouter support. It is designed to support the Scout Method in the Cub Scout section by having Sixes operate independently, in an age appropriate manner, in a camp setting with programme tasks that will develop their leadership, teamwork, & scouting skills. By linking the event with one of the Lands of Adventure, Cub Scouts can also use the camp to help them progress in their Turas/Taisteal/Tagann badges

Additional Details

- The representative Sixes at the event will have qualified at their respective Scout County Challenge. The county qualifier event must be concluded by Sunday May 28th 2017.
- The Land of the Wild Frontier will be the central theme of the Challenge.
- Each Six will be made up of a maximum of 6 Cubs from a mix of ages, not just older Cub Scouts. These Cub Scouts will be on different points along their personal progression journey, i.e. Turas/Taisteal/Tagann.
- The Sixes will have a choice of entering into either of 2 categories for the competition element of the event: unassisted for full marks or assisted for reduced marks.
- Accompanying Scouters will not play a role in the event. Sixes requiring assistance will receive verbal instruction by members of the Cub Scout Programme Team.
- During the Camp craft element of the Challenge, Scouters will not be permitted onto the sites. Scouters are permitted to join their Six in the evening and prepare the campsite for the overnight.
- Participants must be Cub Scouts aged 12 years and under before 31st August 2017
- Further details will be sent to Sixes who qualify for the event.
