- Sixers to ask the Scouts for some help in making a gateway for the party.



Give your tables a more festive touch by adding grass skirts and flowers (thin strips of green plastic bags and flowers from any pound shop).

Sarah's **Red** Travel Card – **Friendships**

Turas – Get to know the Scouts helping out with the gateway by inviting them to the party, as you might end up in their patrol in September.

Taisteal – Before your Sixer leaves for Scouts, thank them for all they have done for you. Make them a mocktail.

Tagann – Buddy up with one of the Beaver Scouts and make sure that they are having a good time. They will remember your kindness.

Do

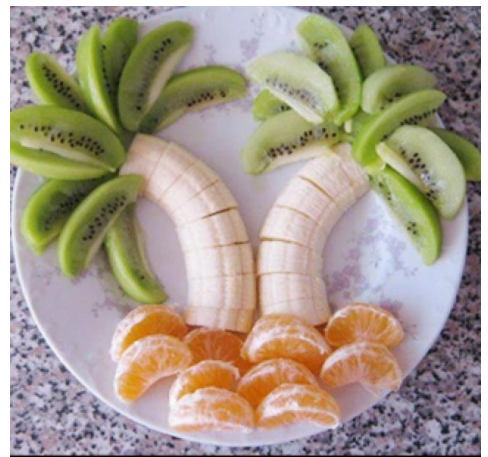
Have a sample of each mocktail on display to make ordering easier for the guests.
