




Campsite layout

As part of your JamborI preparations, we have some advice on planning your patrol site. There's plenty room with 12mx12m. Here are the main points to consider:

- You'll have your tents, boys, girls, scouter's and store. Then your dining shelter. When looking at your 'canvas' remember this is your primary shelter for the camp.
- You need it to be safe, secure and to protect you from the elements. Make sure you have the right poles and pegs for all the tentage and it's a good idea to pitch everything once before you go.



Site Gadgets

Your gadgets should meet the needs of the patrol for the duration of your camp. They allow you to make a living space in just a few hours!

- For your dining area make sure your table and seating is adequate and comfortable for the camp. Also remember it's a jamboree and you're there to meet scouts from all over make new friends so have the facility to invite someone for dinner or supper if you want to.
- Dining Shelter: It should provide ample shelter to cover the entire patrol, and should be easy to enter and exit.
- Bins and wash up area: On camp hygiene is critical as illness can be very contagious with so many living together. You must always wash up with hot water and clean hands. Ensure your dishes are also of an adequate size to fit your pots and pans. Bins need to have segregated sections for waste recycling and liquid. These should be emptied regularly.
- The store needs to be one of the tidiest and cleanest area of the campsite. This is where all your equipment will be stored, in boxes. And all food is stored in a hygienic fashion. Cooler boxes need to be kept clean and of course cold. Cooler Blocks need to be recycled regularly and any waste food needs to be disposed of.



- **Cooking area:** You will have a choice of open fire or gas, and a blend of both is recommended. You need a safe chopping area and a wood pile that is again protected from the rain, we all have tried to cook dinner with wet timber and it is hard. Camp cooking is one of the great scout skills and at a jamboree you and your patrol should aim to show off these skills.
- Every scout campsite should have an entrance gate. One that you will take pride in and shows off some of your pioneering skills. Maybe it'll be a masterpiece in weaving or flying your troop flag as high as possible either way have one.
- **Emergency Point:** This should include a first aid kit and fire safety equipment.
- Finally there are lots of other small additions you can make to your site. A personal wash stand, specially in the mornings when you might just want a quick wash and brush the teeth then it's very handy rather than walking the miles to the toilets and sinks.
